

The role of Somerset Sight is to provide immediate and life-long practical and emotional support so people suffering sight loss can remain independent and not feel alone.

Charles Bonnet Syndrome

Charles Bonnet syndrome (CBS) is a common condition among people who have lost their sight and Somerset Sight wishes to raise awareness of this as it could occur during your progressive sight loss journey.

It is named after the 18th century Swiss scientist and philosopher who first described the condition.

People who have CBS may have lost a lot of their vision from an eve condition, such as agerelated macular degeneration, cataract, glaucoma or diabetic eye disease, and it causes people to see things that aren't really there, known as visual hallucinations.

These can be flashing lights, seeing people in the garden or any other thing that you've not seen before, and they often start after a sudden worsening of vision.

Up to 60 per cent of people who are experiencing serious sight loss may develop it and it is more likely to occur if both eyes are affected by sight loss but can occur with problems in one eye only.

The times the hallucinations are most likely to happen is when a person is quiet and relaxed. Therefore, getting up and moving about can often help to drive the images away temporarily, or by changing activity. Changing the lighting conditions that you are in; making it brighter if it is dark, or dimmer if it is bright, may also help.

CBS can be distressing, but many people find that the visions can get less frequent with time.

Seeing Life Differently (SLDD)

Somerset Sight is the only local organisation offering practical and emotional support for people experiencing sight loss.

These days are designed to support people recently diagnosed to adapt to their new situation and remain as independent as possible. The course takes place on the same day of the week over three consecutive weeks.

Topics covered include aids to daily living, mobility, transport, technology assistance, keeping healthy and safety in the home. Speakers include the Rehabilitation officer, Fire Safety officer, Technology, Emotional support and Low vision therapist.

You will meet people living in your area and have a safe space to discuss challenges faced, share hints and tips and laugh about amusing incidents that we all experience.

You also get to meet key members of Somerset Sight staff and volunteers, who can assist and support you now and in the future.

Comments from recent attendees:

"Everyone has been so helpful, kind & friendly. It has been great to hear and understand other people's ways of coping with their various degrees of sight loss and realising my own visual impairment is not as life changing as I make out. Learning about the tools that are out there for me if/when I may need them."

"I have discovered that there is a great deal of help available and this course has been extremely helpful. I have learnt a lot. Just knowing how you all cope with adversity is useful in itself. It give me hope for the future."

The next SLD days will be on Wednesdays 14th, 21st and 28th February 2024, at Northfield House, Taunton, TA1 1DG.



Technology Support

Sight loss is challenging, requiring you to adapt to find your new normal, whatever that might be. Somerset Sight is here to help you regain your independence with a variety of services. The newest of which is our Technology support service provided by Jenny, our Technology Officer.

Jenny has been a part time staff member since April 2022 and her service has been used over 400 times since joining the charity. Our service users have found her to be "very patient, friendly and knowledgeable".

Jenny says "I enjoy my job, it can be very challenging and rewarding, requiring me to use knowledge and skills I've gained over the years. In particular I use my problem-solving skills all the time, as each service user has unique individual needs.

I love it when I can resolve an issue someone has been struggling with for a long time. There's no better feeling when you're told that your help has been life changing! Seeing the smiles on peoples faces, when they discover they have regained some independence, using their

phone, tablet or any other device to assist them in daily life, it really makes my day.

I always start with the free options already built into the devices. and tailor them to the individual's needs. If the free options are insufficient for their requirements, I will work with them to find a more bespoke solution."

Currently Jenny can try to help you over the phone, and if you need a face to face appointment you can see her in the office at Northfield House, for a suggested donation of £20 an hour. Alternatively, if you need a home visit, there is a charge of £50 for up to 2hours (to cover travel costs). Please call the office on 01823 333818

All monies received help keep this valuable Technology service running.

My Friend Den

I joined Somerset Sight as a Volunteer Visitor in 2017 and was introduced to Den, then aged 93 who lived in a flat in Yeovil. Den was ex-RAF and therefore an aircraft enthusiast. We hit it off immediately and I would go for 2 hrs each week and chat, read books to him and help him with anything - often finding things he'd misplaced.

Den was very keen to write his life story, so he chatted to me as I typed into his computer and over about 2 years we wrote from his childhood to about the time his children were grown up. He had seen one of the very first Spitfire planes being tested when he was 14 and had taken a sneaky picture of it, which he still had. He joined the Air Training Corps at 17 and then the RAF. He flew Wellington and Liberator bombers. After the war Den married, had 3 children and continued his love of aircraft. organising an airshow in 1959 at Merryfield, near Ilton.

He said he would have loved to have flown a Spitfire, and after some investigation I found it was possible to fly in a 2 seater Spitfire. So, in April 2018, the day

before his 94th birthday we drove up to Biggin Hill and he flew in the back of a Spitfire and was able to take the controls. The pilot even did a barrel roll where you go upside down! We managed to do some more flying over the next 3 years with the help of a veteran's charity.

During lockdown I visited twice a week but inevitably Den's mobility reduced and he moved to a care home in Burnham-on-Sea. I carried on visiting once a fortnight and would read him WW2 flying stories. Den died in August aged 99, 2 days after I had last visited him. I know how much my visits meant to him as he would always cry out in joy and grab my hand when I arrived.

I thoroughly enjoyed my stint behind the wheel, exhilarating & a bit scary to!! All went very well as far as I was concerned & I'd like to say thank you Jo for organising it & all your hard work on the day. Alex & Homer

Well Joanne, was I originally disappointed that the carriage driving got cancelled, you bet I was but what replaced it was way up there as an experience that I will certainly not forget. To drive a car as a registered blind person is to most people, just plain daft and to say the least, damn dangerous. Well, what they do not realise is that many if not most blind people are always up for challenging their disability and the many doubting Thomas's who think we should just stay at home in front of the telly. When it came to my go, as normal for someone with Parkinson's, my stress levels had risen somewhat but once I was strapped into the drivers' seat, the driving instructor put me at ease sitting as I was in his automatic driving school car. Under soft and positive directions we drove through a set of barriers and out onto the runway. Turning left, I drove quietly down to the end of the runway and slowly started to turn the car around so that we were facing the full length of the runway. The next instruction was to say the least, unexpected

but one that I was pleased to do. "Floor it" said the instructor and so I did, reaching some 70 mph. Turning round at the other end. We repeated the exercise, avoiding slower cars going in the same or in a couple of cases in the opposite direction. 30 minutes later and on my last run before the session was over, I put the pedal to the metal halfway through the turn for my last chance to brake the current record for a visually impaired person, which was 80 MPH, and we did it, leaving the braking to the last possible moment before we ran out of runway. 81 Miles per Hour with your eyes shut


